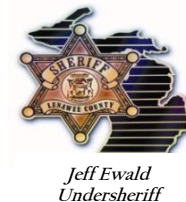

Criminal Justice Committee Report January 7, 2021

On January 1st, 2021 the Lenawee County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol transitioned to our new "Standard Duty Uniform" which consists of the Black Blauer Class B uniform that the CJ Committee had seen in a previous presentation. The transition was very well planned by Captain Pifer and executed with only minor hiccups. The Staff was presented with a new policy that covered the Standard Duty Uniform as well as an email to Staff on the manufacturer's suggested care and maintenance. The feedback from the Staff was extremely positive. It will be interesting to see the public's reaction.

The Sheriff's Office took delivery of the new Sig Sauer 9mm handguns and will be working on a transition plan that includes: issuing the new weapons; issuing new "Mollie" vest carriers; a revised firearm policy; trading in the current pistols; and pistol qualifications. This will begin towards the end of the first quarter and should be completed by the middle of the second quarter.

Recent retirements and other openings at the Sheriff's Office have created the need to prioritize hiring and promotional opportunities, although we never really stopped. We anticipate promoting a Road Patrol Sergeant over the next few months, promoting a Dispatch Shift Leader and sending one or two persons to the police academy. Finding good qualified applicants has become increasingly difficult over the last two years.

Lenawee County Central Dispatch was advised that the State of Michigan will no longer fund the SMART911 program statewide. According to Dispatch Director Lt. Aungst, Dispatch Centers wishing to continue this life-saving program will have to fund the \$8,000 out of their 911 budgets. The Sheriff's Office and County Administration believe that funding the program is well worth the cost and will provide citizens with the tool to help save time and possibly lives.

Lastly, the Lenawee County Sheriff's Office participated in "Shop with a Cop" this past Christmas season albeit with a totally different look but the same outcome. The Sheriff's Office partnered with Walmart to provide 57 children with Walmart gift cards worth \$150 each. Sheila Gray from Walmart coordinated the families retrieving the cards so that COVID restrictions were followed and the family was able to shop with the kids. Thank you to all who participated!

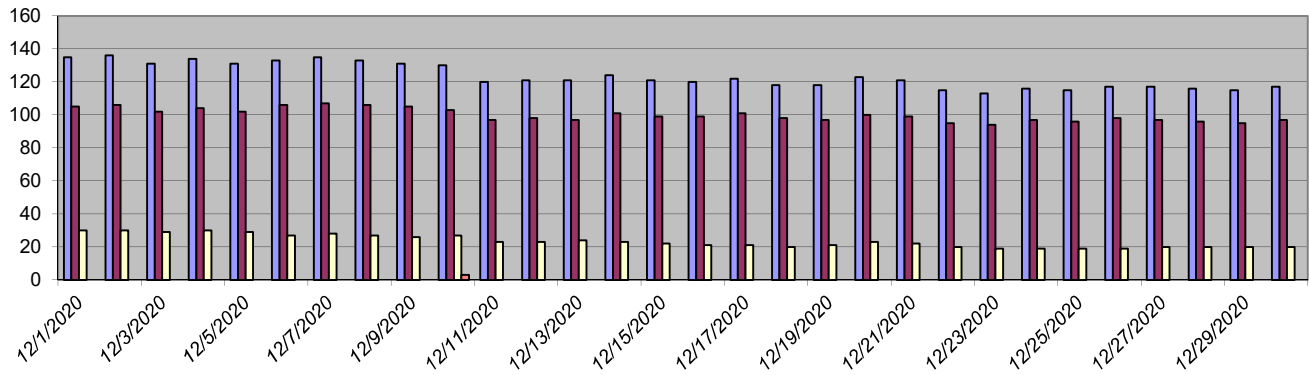

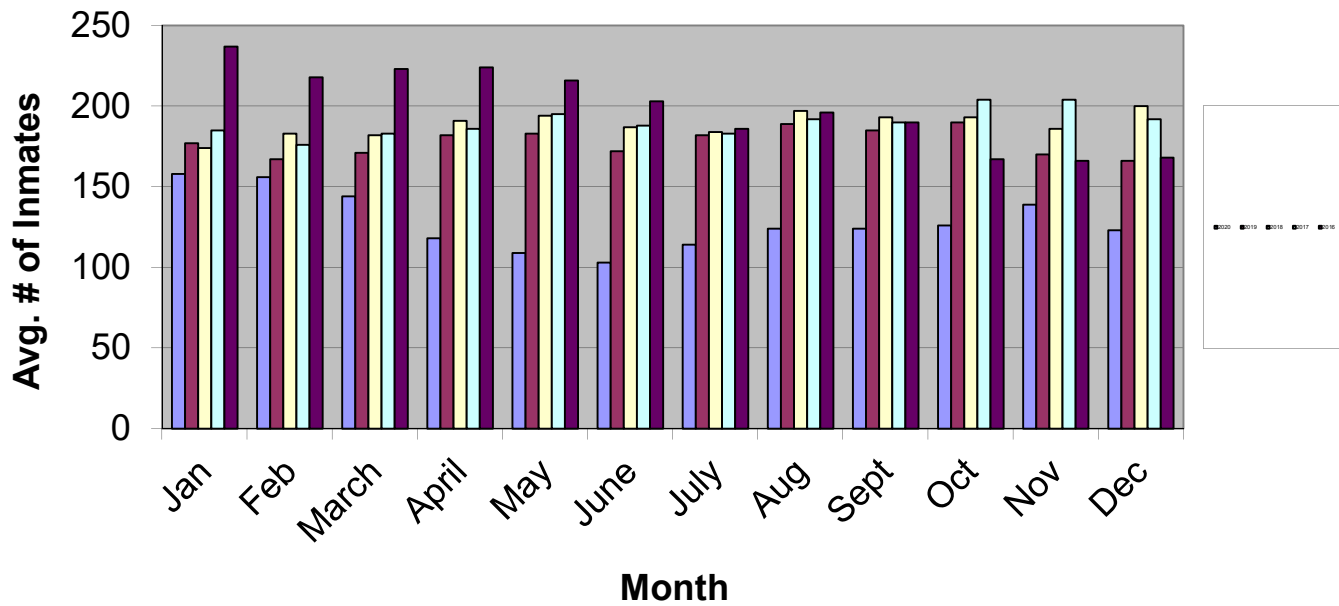
