Minutes: Thursday, September 5, 2024

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM by Comm. Collins

II. Approval of Minutes

A. Approval of Minutes: August 1, 2024

Motion by Krasny to approve the minutes from August 1, 2024, seconded by Van Doren. Motion carried.

III. Finance Reports

A. Finance Report

Administrator Murphy reviewed the finance reports included in the packet.

Motion by Van Doren to accept the report, seconded by Krasny. Motion carried.

IV. Sheriff

A. Sheriff's Report

Sheriff Bevier reviewed his monthly report. MDOC's annual inspection took place at the jail. The Sheriff's Office successfully navigated another large event at the Michigan International Speedway, that was geo-fenced for the 102 calls to 911, most of which were accidental. Training was recently completed for their new accident/crime scene processing system, that uses a drone to create 3D images of the scene for the accident investigation team.

Sheriff shared that October 10, 2024 an open house and employee appreciation will take place at their office, to bring employees and the public together.

Discussion was held regarding the increased vehicle accidents. Sheriff stated a meeting is in the works to discuss reasons for the increase in accidents and possible solutions.

B. Request: AXON Taser 10 Contract

AXON is the manufacturer of "taser" electronic control devices. Some devices being used were over 20 years old and other devices are only 5 years old, but the support for devices are being phased out. The request is to approve a 5-year contract with AXON for their Taser 10 device, holster, batteries, cartridges, training cartridges, training materials, warranty, tech support, docking stations, online evidence management, instructor certification. The contract would be paid out over 5 years; \$30,000 in 2024, \$59,965.00 annually for years 2-5.

Motion by Van Doren, to recommend approving the contract with Axon for \$269,860.00 to be paid over 5 year period, to the Board of Commissioners, seconded by Krasny. Motion carried.

V. Prosecuting Attorney

A. Prosecutor's Report

Chief Prosecutor Wyse included her monthly report in the packet. Wyse stated certain vehicle accident charges may be referred to their Diversion program that is designed to teach better skills and create more efficient drivers; they are determined on a case-by-case basis.

The public defender's monthly report is included in the packet, no further discussion.

VII. Emergency Management

A. Emergency Management Report

Coordinator Tanis shared highlights from his monthly report. Tanis discussed the train derailment in Adrian on August 2nd, utilizing the drone for accident photos. The Carbon Dioxide tank caused road closures during the clean-up and track repair.

VIII. Medical Examiner

A. Medical Examiner Office's Report

Dr. Maino reviewed the monthly report from Medical Examiner's office. Total autopsy YTD 88 for Lenawee & Hillsdale. 26 deaths have been investigated.

There have been a total of 34 Trauma related deaths YTD; falls are the most common trauma related death for those 65 years and older.

Dr. Maino will look at the average age of deaths from auto accidents.
