Minutes: Thursday, July 10, 2025

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 by Vice Chairman Bevier. Vice Chairman Bevier started the meeting with a moment of silence for Chairman Chief Tony Cuevas.

II. Approval of Minutes

A. Approval of Minutes: ____

F/Lt Bow made a motion to approve the May 2025 meeting minutes, a motion seconded by Chief Grayer. No discussion, motion carried.

III. Reports - Emergency 911 District Board

A. E911 Finance Report

Lt. Perdue advised we should be at 50.41% at this time, currently we are at 42%. Lt. Perdue explained that she just received a bill for the annual tower monitoring and maintenance in the amount of just over \$26,000.00.

B. E911 Director's Report

Director's Report was attached to the packet. Lt. Perdue highlighted a few items. First being congratulating Nicole Kost and Adam Daggs on their promotions to Shift Leaders and joining the Leadership Team. The second item is an update on the Link Layer authentication of the

radios with Lucas County. The latest update is that the flash codes have arrived, and the installation has been scheduled. The third item is that the back-up HVAC has been completed and will be taken off the agenda. The fourth item to highlight is the tower site repairs. Once these repairs are complete, they should be good for the life of the tower. The fifth item is to replace the MEVO anywhere kit (MAK) as the current kit is becoming outdated and can not support newer technologies.

Mr. Craig Tanis made a motion to approve and send forward the approval for the purchase of an updated MAK with the amount of \$9275.00 for the first year and \$6660.00 a year for the remaining 4 years. This was seconded by Commissioner Aungst. Mr. Tanis asked how this would fit within the 5-year plan. Lt. Perdue advised it would be covered under the technology upgrade portion. Motion carried.

Next, it has been brought up that there have been inconsistencies with in building coverage throughout the County, specifically Blissfield. Lt. Perdue is bringing up the issue to the board to discuss possible solutions to this problem. Sheriff Bevier reiterated that when the study was done it was for outside coverage and the board knew there could be indoor issues. Chief Greenleaf of Blissfield Police Department spoke on how the issues were found and what one of the possible solutions could be. Further discussion was held, highlighting other in-door coverage areas that have issues getting out along with possible funding for the project.

F/Lt. Bow explained that MSP just bought new radios and offered to do some testing with newer radios to rule out the age of the current radios in the county.

Lastly, we have currently hired Briahna Lindeman and she is in the training phase. We are also taking applications for the last open Dispatcher position.
